**Cory Doctorow** ([craphound.com](http://craphound.com)) is a science fiction author, activist, and journalist. His latest novels are *The Bezzle* (a followup to *Red Team Blues*) and *The Lost Cause*, a solarpunk science fiction novel of hope amidst the climate emergency. His most recent nonfiction book is *The Internet Con: How to Seize the Means of Computation*, a Big Tech disassembly manual. He is the author of the international young adult *Little Brother* series. He is also the author of *Chokepoint Capitalism* (with Rebecca Giblin), about creative labor markets and monopoly; *HOW TO Destroy Surveillance Capitalism*, nonfiction about conspiracies and monopolies; and of *Radicalized* and *Walkaway*, science fiction for adults, a YA graphic novel called *In Real Life*; and other young adult novels like *Pirate Cinema*. His first picture book was *Posey The Monster Slayer*. He maintains a daily blog at [Pluralistic.net](http://Pluralistic.net). He works for the Electronic Frontier Foundation, is a MIT Media Lab Research Affiliate, is a Visiting Professor of Computer Science at Open University, a Visiting Professor of Practice at the University of North Carolina's School of Library and Information Science and co-founded the UK Open Rights Group. Born in Toronto, Canada, he now lives in Los Angeles. In 2020, he was inducted into the Canadian Science Fiction and Fantasy Hall of Fame. In 2022, he earned the Sir Arthur Clarke Imagination in Service to Society Awardee for lifetime achievement. York University (Canada) made him an Honourary Doctor of Laws; and the Open University (UK) made him an Honourary Doctor of Computer Science.

His publications can be found in journals such as *Philosophy and Rhetoric*, *Communication Theory*, *Human Studies*, *Semiotica*, *The Review of Communication*, *Explorations in Media Ecology*, *The Atlantic Journal of Communication*, and *Communication Studies*. Anton is author of *Selfhood and Authenticity* (2001, SUNY Press), *Sources of Significance: Worldly Rejuvenation and Neo-Stoic Heroism* (2010, Purdue University Press), *How Non-Being Haunts Being: On Possibilities, Morality and Death Acceptance* (2020, Fairleigh Dickinson University Press), *A. EYE CANDY: A Museum of Imaginary Robots and Other Digital Delights* (2023, IGS Press) and the collection *Communication Uncovered: General Semantics and Media Ecology* (2010, IGS Press). He is the editor of *Valuation and Media Ecology: Ethics, Morals, and Laws* (2010, Hampton Press), co-editor, along with Lance Strate, of the collection *Korzybski And...* (2012, IGS Press), and co-editor, along with Robert K.
